




Update: Monterey Bay Chapter of the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation

Mission and Vision

- Chapter was founded in 2017, 25th anniversary of MBNMS.
- Our Vision: A healthy MBNMS recognized as a national treasure for its unique and abundant biodiversity, and widespread community support.
- Our Mission: To inspire the public to protect MBNMS through participation in and support of sanctuary programs, projects, and partnerships.
- We work in partnership with the Office of National Marine Sanctuaries and National Marine Sanctuary Foundation (NMSF) to:
 - Engage the public through public outreach and education programs.
 - Advocate on behalf of Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary.
 - Develop and strengthen partnerships to protect biodiversity and enhance ecosystem health in the sanctuary through coordinated action.





Fundraising

- The chapter began raising funds in earnest in 2019.
- Based on 2019 earnings, \$100,000 is being distributed:
 - \$50,000 for Bay Net and Team OCEAN
 - \$35,000 for Whale Disentanglement Team
 - \$15,000 for awareness (Whale Fest, Santa Cruz Warrior's partnership, video).

Hope to distribute \$106,000 in 2021, if 2020 fundraising holds up.



How money is being raised

- Grant writing, individual donors, events.
- Hope to do events depending on public health emergency status - may have to do some virtually:
 - Big Sur Concert: Aug 15th
 - Sea Stars Brunch: Sept 20th
 - Sardine Factory Dinner: October
 - Holiday party: December

Capitol Hill Ocean Week




- This year, NMSF held it virtually on June 9.
